Session I Classes– June 18th – July 3rd

Period 1 Classes 9:00-9:45

Welcome to Kindergarten

Let's get ready for Kindergarten at Gooden School! This class will be an introduction to Gooden, full of fun activities, read-alouds and plenty of opportunities for positive social interaction. Activities will include letter, shape and number reinforcement as well as basic skills such as cutting and coloring. Of course, the activities will reflect the students' skill needs. We will also learn about Gooden's three R's: Respect for self, respect for others and respect for the world. ***Please note that this class takes up two periods and is considered two classes.***

ISEE/HSPT Test Prep Math for Grades 7&8

Mrs. Kraemer

This class is designed as a preview of the ISEE and HSPT tests required for application to independent high schools. The course will look at the different components of the ISEE and HSPT test in Math through practice exams and discussion of the essential concepts covered on the tests. Test taking strategies relevant to these tests will also be discussed. Students may be expected to complete work outside of class time in preparation. ***Students will be required to purchase a test prep book. A link to purchase the book will be emailed upon enrollment.***

Yoga for grades 1-8**Mrs. Dominguez**

Build strength, balance, coordination, and class community in our all ages yoga class. Performing poses for each skill level and practicing breathing will calm and relax you to start your day right. Bring your yoga mat, comfortable clothes, and good attitude to become the ultimate junior yogi.

Guitar for grades 4-8**Mr. Williamson**

Bring an acoustic or nylon string guitar and learn how to play chords and use these chords to play folk songs. Many of these songs will be from The American Songbook. No prior experience necessary.

Math Skills for grades 3-5**Mr. Foster**

Across Grades 3 to 5 many of the mathematical concepts that the children learn require them to be able to add and subtract, apply their knowledge of times tables and recall division facts at lightning speed. Automaticity of these math facts is an essential foundation for moving forward in middle school math, and students without these tools often struggle to keep up. This class aims to develop children's confidence and speed at solving calculations in their head, by introducing them to a range of fun and engaging mental math strategies and methods.

Jewelry Making for grades 1-2**Ms. Hoshino**

Do you enjoy wearing your own creations or making your very own gifts? We will be making an array of beaded jewelry including: friendship pins, bracelets, key chains and necklaces. We will also learn how to make our own beads from different materials. Come join in the fun as we learn the basics of jewelry making!

Ukulele – Song a Day for grades 3-6**Mrs. Ewen**

This ukulele class will move more quickly than ukulele for our youngest learners. The class emphasis will be on folk song singing and ukulele playing. We will also explore a few strumming and plucking patterns as well.

We will be covering many topics including, but not limited to; operations with fractions, decimals, integers, converting, and computing algebraic equations. This is the perfect course to make sure your math skills are sharp before the new school year!

Language Arts for grades 3-5

Across Grades 3 to 5 children are introduced to a wide range of grammatical skills that serve as the foundation for any accurate and competent writer. The problem is that grammatical terminology is often confusing and overly complicated, meaning that students are left puzzling over what it means rather than focusing on how to apply it in their written work. This class aims to take key punctuation marks, word classes and sentence types, and build children's confidence at using them both accurately and creatively in pieces of writing.

STEAM-Engineering Design Challenge for grades 1-2

ENGINEERS WANTED! Who can build the highest tower out of JUST spaghetti noodles and masking tape? Who can build a structure out of straws that will support a tennis ball above the table for 15 seconds or more? Or a paper table that can hold a dictionary? In this class, groups of students will plan and participate in hands-on activities that focus on the engineering design process. They will use simple, everyday materials and compare their various design strategies and solutions. We will CREATE our fun!
