### Kindergarten & First Grade Block

**Mrs. Dominguez & Mrs. Gonzalez**

Are you new to Gooden? Whether you spent part of the year at Gooden or are starting classes for the first time, this summer refresher will prepare students for their future at Gooden. The day will be full of fun activities, read-alouds, art/movement, and plenty of opportunities for positive social interaction. Classroom activities will reflect the students' skill needs as well as learning routines that will be helpful in the transition into the Gooden family. We will also learn about Gooden's 3R's: Respect for Self, respect for Others, and Respect for the World. *Please note that this class takes up four class periods.*

### Creative Writing for Grades 4-8

It is exciting to be a part of a writing movement! Our students will craft stories and short essays that showcase their creativity and style. Honing their ears for dialogue and using research and collaboration to expand understanding, students will refine their writing skills, engage in creative writing exercises, and comment on each other's work. Types of creative writing covered include: journals, storytelling, vignettes, lyrics, scripts, speeches, and journalism.

### Language Arts for Grades 2-3

Across second and third grades children are introduced to a wide range of grammatical skills that serve as the foundation for any accurate and competent writer. The problem is that grammatical terminology is often confusing and overly complicated, meaning that students are left puzzling over what it means rather than focusing on how to apply it in their written work. This class aims to take key punctuation marks, word classes and sentence types, and build children's confidence at using them both accurately and creatively in pieces of writing.
